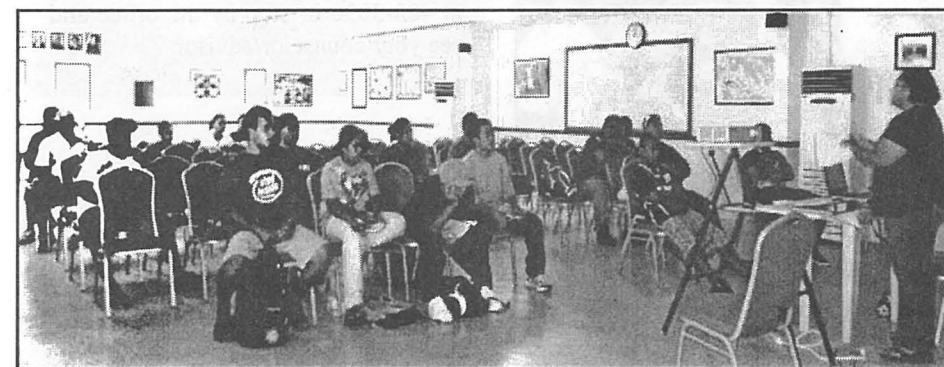

CACG Video Training Held

Ministry of Education's College Access Challenge Grant extended its invitation to PCC's Educational Talent Search (ETS) Program staff to attend the training on CACG Video Training on September 25, 2012. The idea behind this training is to train the trainers on how to avail information on college access to all students in the Republic, informing students and parents that a college education is obtainable to anyone.

Mr. Dean Curtis who is the owner of the "Catch the Dream Company" conducted the training for professional staffs from each school including ETS staff. The

training was specifically designed to teach teachers or counselors how to utilize and deliver video information effectively using available resources from CACG. Although the videos focused on accessing college education, the FAMA Discussion is a technique that applies to any information on videos that integrates learning and action resulting in instant understanding of information and longer retention of what was received.

Important Announcement To All PCC Students

It is very important that you meet with your advisor before early registration on October 25 & 26, 2012. Early Registration steps are as follows:

- * Get clearance from Office of Admissions & Financial Aid
- * Pay \$50.00 tuition deposit and get your receipt and clearance from Student Account
- * Pick-up registration packet at Registrations & Records Office
- * At Student Life Office, sign-in to see your counselor, fill out your Registra-

tion Worksheet while you wait to see your advisor

- * Once you see advisor, return to Registration & Records office and submit your worksheet to technician, and wait for your official class schedule.
- * If a class is closed, register into another class, get a copy of your class schedule, a drop/add form and return to Student Life Office to see your advisor again.
