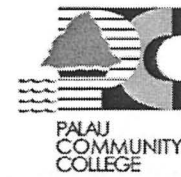

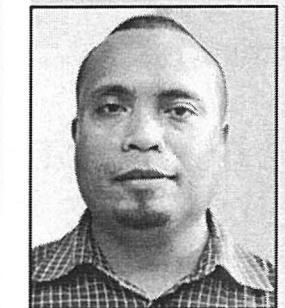

## Vandalism at Multi-Species Hatchery

Palau Community College would like to inform the public that on Monday, November 5, 2012, it discovered that its Milkfish (Mesekelat) Broodstock in the floating cages at the College's Multi-Species Hatchery in Ngermetengel, Ngaremlengui state had been vandalized. The cage's protective net had been cut and milkfish (mesekelat) kept and raised since 2009 are missing. The College has notified the Bureau of Public Safety, and would like to assist in the investigation by soliciting the assistance of the community for information that may help in the investigation. 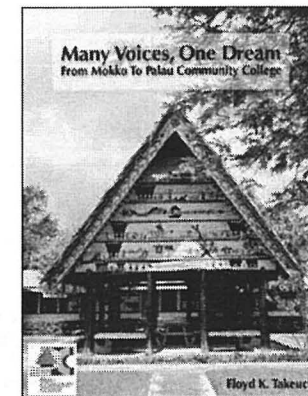

with their majors. The workforce exposure was to provide them with a firsthand experience of the kind of jobs that are available, and the required knowledge and skills.

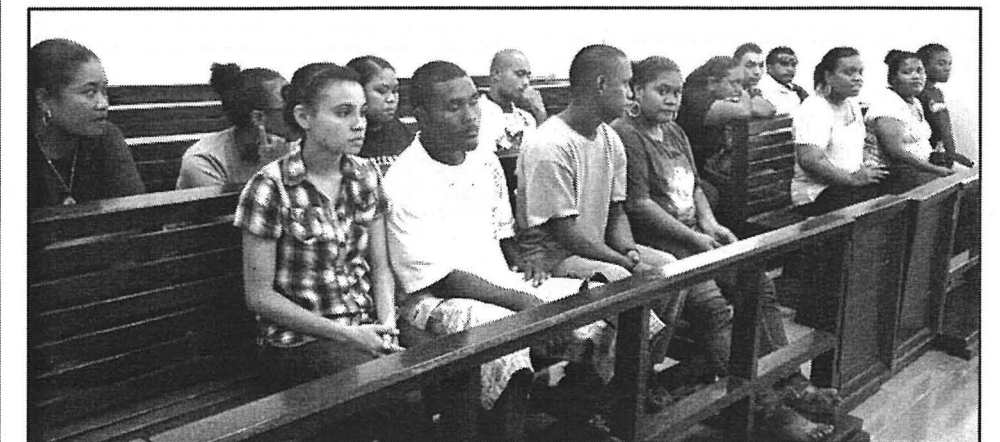
