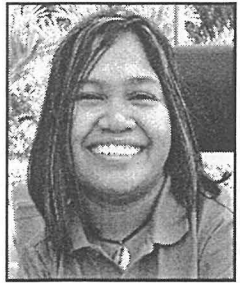


## Alumni Notes

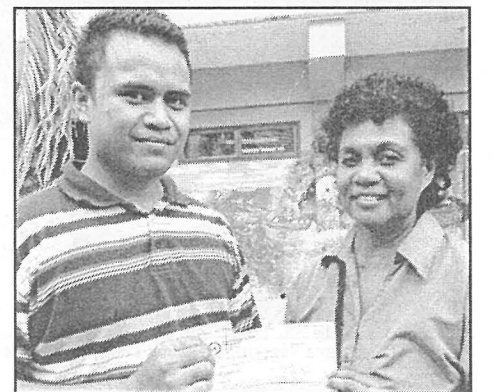
## Donors Donate

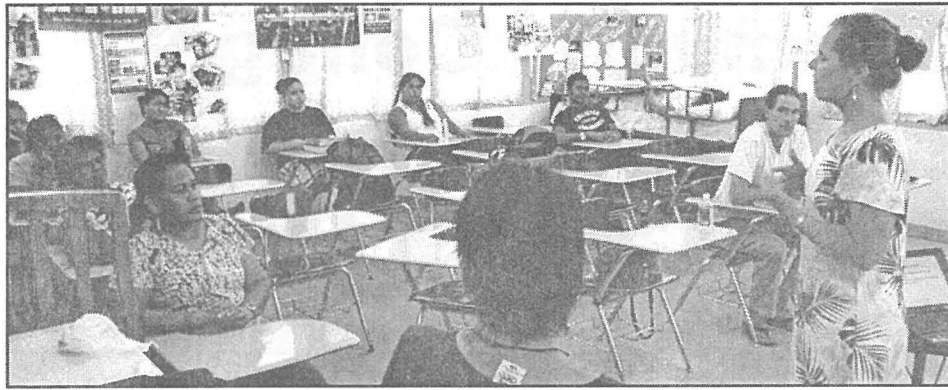


Dilubch receiving donation from Fernando Takeshi of Surangel & Sons.

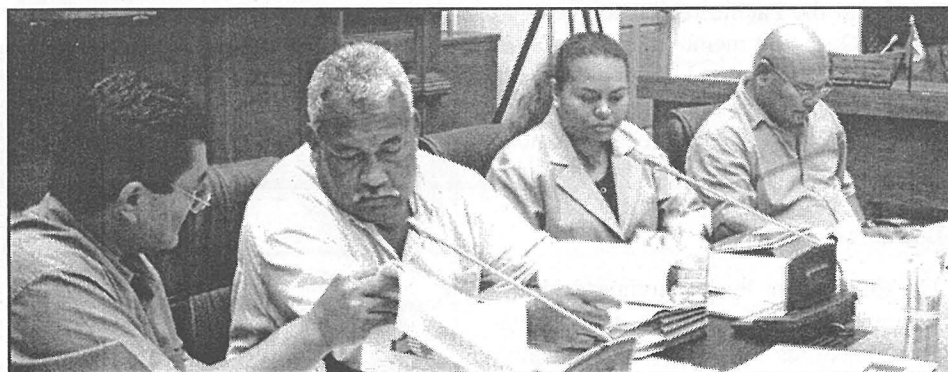

## MOH Press Release

**Dengue Fever, Flu and Gastroenteritis Cases in November** - Although an outbreak of dengue fever has not been declared, cases continue to be seen at the Belau National Hospital, as well as an increase in flu and gastroenteritis cases.

The public is urged to use insect repellent, maintain cleanliness around homes and yards, practice hygienic habits such as hand washing and proper food handling. By following these preventive measures, one minimizes and can prevent the risk of getting dengue, the flu or gastroenteritis.

## CHL Program Introduced

The Children's Healthy Living (CHL) program was introduced on November 02, 2011 by Cooperative Research and Extension (CRE) to the local advisory committee made up of community agencies. This program is funded by the United States Department of Agriculture National Institute of Food and Agriculture (USDA-NIFA). The goal of CHL is to build a social, cultural, political, economic, and physical environment in the Pacific Region that supports active play, physical activity and eating healthy food in order to promote health targeted to children 2-8 years old. This came about due to research within the region that indicated that prevalence of overweight and obesity has been estimated at 60 to 90% of the adult population and 15 to 45% of 2-8 year olds. The local advisory committee is tasked to provide advice and feedback to the CHL Program Steering Committee (PSC) and to help develop potential local policy changes while aiding CHL's alignment with other community programs who

share a similar mission.

The CHL program has scholarships to CHL approved degree programs available for two candidates. Approved degree programs are at University of Alaska, University of Guam, University of Hawaii-Manoa and University of Hawaii Community Colleges. Financial aid are for both undergraduate and graduate programs. There is a selection process and criteria too that is in place for getting into the program.
